Questions

TO CONSIDER

1. What stood out to you as you listened to the message today? What did you learn about God....about yourself?

2. In Numbers 18, provision for the priesthood in the Promised Land was outlined. While they wouldn't receive any portion of land, the Lord promised them, "I am your portion" (Numbers 18:20). How does this beautiful promise apply to you? What assurance from it can you rest in? What role does your faith play in receiving this promise from the Lord?

3. The Israelites' expressed desires were often associated with physical things. Psalm 106:15 (KJV) says, "The Lord gave them their request; but sent leanness into their soul." Identify and discuss the compromise and consequence when God finally gave them what they wanted. What lesson(s) can you learn from this?

4. When God seemingly fails to provide in the manner and measure expected, it's easy to resort to complaining. God had provided manna for the Hebrew people, but they craved meat. What was the greater issue? Discuss the difference between the Israelites' complaining and that of the psalmist in Psalm 55:17, "Evening and morning and at noon I utter my complaint and moan, and he hears my voice."
